COURSE DESCRIPTION

Autistic Spectrum Disorder: A Lifespan Perspective – Will describe the areas of development impacted by ASD, the symptoms seen in children with differing degrees of impairment, and the evolution of symptoms over time. It will also highlight key underlying neuropsychological deficits, and explain how these deficits contribute to the overall picture of ASD. Normal developmental milestones will be reviewed and the difference between delay and atypicality will be explained. A 3-dimensional model of ASD will be laid out, incorporating degree of atypicality, level of general intelligence and the evolution of symptoms of ASD over time, drawing on Leo Kanner's original (1943) description, as well as six decades of scientific research.

Developmental Therapies for ASD – Will review and describe the range of generally accepted behavioral and educational modalities used with children on the autistic spectrum. The concepts of bottom-up and top-down cognitive function will be introduced. The manner in which these concepts can be applied to the 3D model of ASD and used to select the most appropriate therapy for any given child at successive points in time will be discussed.

Behavior Management & Psychopharmacology for Children with ASD – Will describe the maladaptive behaviors commonly seen in children with ASD, and the underlying neuropsychological traits responsible for these behaviors. Behavioral interventions including positive and negative reinforcement, extinction, overcorrection, fading, chaining, and token economies will be explained. The role of commonly used medications including their benefits, limitations, and risks will be discussed.

Sense and Nonsense in the Treatments of ASD – Will present a set of criteria that can be applied to all interventions for ASD to decide if they are worth the risk and expense. Developmental therapies that have been associated with behavioral deterioration rather than improvement, and biomedical interventions that have been associated with brain damage also will be discussed.

James Coplan, M.D. earned his B.A. from Dartmouth College and his M.D. from New York Medical College. He has been a faculty member and Training Director at numerous medical centers and hospitals in NY and PA.. In 2004, Dr. Coplan formed his own practice -Neurodevelopmental Pediatrics of the Main Line, PC, www.NDPeds.com. Dr. Coplan also maintains an active teaching role within the University of Pennsylvania and is active as an author and public speaker on the subjects of early child development, speech and language delay, and autistic spectrum disorders. Dr. Coplan has attained recognition in all three medical specialties pertaining to child development: Pediatrics (Fellow, American Academy of Pediatrics, and Board Certified in Developmental-Behavioral Pediatrics), Child Neurology (Fellow, Child Neurology Society, and Board Certified, Neurodevelopmental Disabilities), and Child Psychiatry (Clinical Associate Professor of Psychiatry at the University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine).

Dr. Coplan's book, Making Sense of Autistic Spectrum Disorders: Create the brightest future for your child with the best treatment options (Bantam-Dell, 2010), introduces a revolutionary three-dimensional model of ASD that simultaneously takes into account a child's atypical features, level of general intelligence, and age. This 3D model provides a "roadmap" on which to chart a child's progress over time, and a framework for making decisions about the best therapies at each stage of development. His book also addresses the many conflicting claims regarding causation of ASD, proven and unproven interventions, and possible reasons for the so-called "explosion" of cases of ASD.
